Core Team Minutes: Sept 13, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 10am, Joan Hagedorn presiding in the absence of Bobbe Moutray.

Joan Hagedorn offered the opening prayer.

Treasurer's Report : Bob submitted reports for last month:

Julie reported that an insert about the Sages will be in this week's bulletin. She also reported that 35 people trained in the kitchen and that all passed.

Secretary's Report: Two changes to last month's minutes: Corrected the spelling of Kadie Engstrom's name Afternoon Lunch and Shopping will be on November 15.

Committee reports:

Communications: No Report.

Hospitality: Jane reported that 7 people have signed up to bring salads and 7 are bringing desserts for the general meeting on Sunday. Chicken salad on croissants and pimiento cheese will be served as the main entrée this Sunday.

Programs: Georgiana reported that Kadie Engstrom is speaking at this month's meeting. Possible speakers for October include some of our parishioners who are from Germany or the owner of the Irish Rover. A potential speaker in the future

includes someone from EMS Louisville. It was suggested that if she is unable to schedule a speaker for a future meeting we could show the DVD from one or more of our past trips. This could potentially generate interest in those members who have not participated in the past.

Membership: Carl reported that 51 members and 7 guests attended the general meeting in August. As a result of a recent telephone survey of all Sages participants 35 people have asked to be removed from the Sages database. We were unable to reach 48 others. This process is ongoing.

Social: Suzanne reported that not many people have signed up for the Bingo to date. Julie will try to get the word out to more people through an e-mail. Donated prizes for the Bingo should be left on the back porch. We also have \$50 to use as cash prizes. Lunch at the Bristol is November 15 after the Core Team meeting. Also Talbot's will have a mini fashion show for us at their store after lunch. Young Hearts will entertain at the Christmas party this year. Jane reported that they are also performing at the Ursuline Arts Center this Sunday. Voting for the destination of the **2019** Sages trip will take place at the Christmas party. The Derby Museum is offering package deals for groups. Suzanne will get the dates for the Senior Day.

Sunshine: Pat reported that she sent one card for a death. She also asked that she be notified if someone who is home-bound wishes to receive a birthday card in the mail.

Spiritual: Joan reported that 40 people attended the Sages Retreat. She reminded us that the Sages Mass will be November 19.

Julie will delete this ministry from the Parish Stewardship list.

The leader of the meeting will be flexible about the amount of free time before the meeting formally begins. However, no announcements will be made while people are in line to get food.
